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

What to Expect from Olympion

hildren love Olympion; adults love its impact! By God's grace, here's what it will do in the lives of your children to lead them to love and worship Jesus Christ:

- deepen their knowledge of and love for the Word of God
- o increase their enthusiasm for memorizing Scripture
- teach them the Gospel and equip them to share it

Overall Focus and Bible Lesson Summary

Our deep desire is that in tracing the footsteps of godly Joshua and the wandering Israelites, the children encounter God as they see Him revealed in His Word, and understand that He is entirely worthy of their utmost trust and total obedience. As the Bible Lesson Curriculum says, "The Book of Joshua teaches us the necessity of knowing who God is, the character of God as He is defined in the Bible, so that we trust Him wholeheartedly with our lives" (page 3).

Through the Bible lessons the children learn that:

- God is faithful. His people can trust and obey Him or listen to their fears and disobey.
- God's salvation is for anyone who will flee to Him for refuge.
- In His mercy, God has made a way to justly destroy our sin.
- Jesus is the Faithful One and the believer's ultimate inheritance.

Format

Olympion's unique format frees you as *Coach* (classroom teacher) to *focus on knowing your students!*

Typical Day

Coaches *do not* teach the Bible lesson, lead recreation, give the Gospel presentation, etc., enabling you to concentrate on discipling the children under your direct care.

Daily Opening Ceremonies—Each day, Olympion begins with a rousing opening assembly of all Athletes and Staff that includes singing, the missions focus, *Course Instructions* (daily announcements), and Gospel Presentation—all with a skit woven through to add humor, fun, and truth.



Training Centers—Athletes then head by Leagues to their classrooms (training centers) to meet in small groups with their *Coaches* and *Assistant Coaches* for activities focused around God's Word, learning and reciting completed Bible memory and reporting service projects.

During the Games—From that point, varied schedules have the Athletes going to the Bible lesson, out for recreation, crafts, and snacks, and back to the Training Center for lesson application worksheets, memory work, and completing service projects.

Daily Closing Ceremonies—Each day concludes with a second all-group assembly filled with singing, a review of the day's Bible focus, and prayer—again with the day's skit woven throughout.

ave you ever wished you could compete in the Olympics? Perhaps win a gold medal? If your answer is yes, it's time to pack your athletic bag and head straight for the Olympion locker room! You are invited to enter the exciting, adventure-filled race of Olympion!

Olympion is where you can train to run the race of life and faith, which has a heavenly prize waiting for you that is more awesome than all the Olympic gold in the world!

At Olympion, you'll meet Joshua, a great Bible champion, and be challenged to put your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ, who died on a cross to pay for our sins and bring us to victory.

Throughout Olympion's events, you and your fellow Athletes will cheer each other on as you earn bronze, silver, and gold medal stickers, and world records, as you:

- memorize verses from the Bible (Gospel Presentation)
- complete worksheets (Training Log entry)
- do things to help others
- read your Bible (Bible Exploration)

The Refueling Station (snacks) and Games for Athletes will keep you in top shape.

The Bible says that we can throw off everything that weighs us down so we can run with endurance the race that is set before us. Looking to Jesus is the best thing you can do! So let's get started.

The race of your life is about to begin. Olympion runners, take your mark! Get set!! **GO!!!**



Master the Games

Knowing Olympion inside and out—"getting" its theme, format, and curriculum content—is key to strengthening your effectiveness and enjoyment. The above letter to the Athletes will help you catch the vision!

Format

Olympion is typically a five-day, three-hour-a-day for 4-year olds through Grade 6 completed (plus a class for 2 & 3 year olds of staff, if desired). Ideally the week concludes with the Olympion Finale, a final closing program for family and friends.

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Athlete Gear

In order to meet their daily goals, each Athlete needs to bring the following "gear" to Olympion every day:

Bible

Athletes are asked to bring Bibles each day to:

- complete Bible lesson worksheets
- foster daily reading of the Word
- familiarize them with their Bibles

• Training Log (student book)

The Olympion Training log is:

- a key element of the Athletes' day throughout the week and quickly becomes a prized possession
- used continually for activities on-site and at home
- taken home each day so that Service opportunities, Bible Exploration, and memory work can be done in the evening and initialed by a parent or guardian A parent letter on the inside cover explains how they can help their children throughout the week.
