What to Expect from Upward Bound

Children love Upward Bound; adults love its impact! By God's grace, here's what it will do in the lives of your children as you lead them to love and worship Jesus Christ:

- deepen their knowledge of and love for the Word of God
- increase their enthusiasm for memorizing Scripture
- teach them the Gospel and equip them to share it

Overall Focus and Bible Lesson Truth Summary

Written with a passionate desire for children to see Jesus as He truly is—to know, love, and trust Him as they never have before—Upward Bound focuses on Christ's astonishing incarnate journey to win our salvation.

Tracking Jesus' perilous footsteps from the Courts of Heaven to the cross and back again to the Summit, your VBS "Backpackers" will learn from the gospel of Luke that

- for Jesus, being Upward Bound meant fully doing His Father's will, every step of the way
- all people are born with an Earthly Bound attitude and need to repent and be saved by grace
- having an Upward Bound attitude requires moment-to-moment reliance on the power of the Holy Spirit
- because Jesus undertook this journey for them, they, too, can reach the Summit through faith in Him

Format

■ Staff

By dividing up the activities among different leaders, Upward Bound's format frees the classroom teachers to focus on getting to know their students and enables them to concentrate on discipling the children under their direct care.

■ Children's Grade Groups

Backpackers are divided into the following grade-group *Expeditions* for age-specific learning and activities:

- Expedition A Grades 5 & 6 completed
 Expedition B Grades 3 & 4 completed
- Expedition C Grades 1 & 2 completed
- Expedition E 2's & 3's (usually your Staff's toddlers)



Upward Bound is designed to be a five-day, three-hours-a-day program, ending with a final closing program celebration. With minor modifications, it can also be used in a variety of other ways.

A Typical Upward Bound Day

ach Upward Bound day generally includes the following components for Grades 1–6. Times listed reflect a schedule for churches with two or more Storytellers, allowing for Bible lesson times to overlap for different grade levels. 4's–K and 2's & 3's Expeditions follow a different schedule. See pages 77–79 in Additional Resources for sample schedules for all grade levels, plus a sample schedule for churches with one Storyteller.

(shaded areas indicate rotating activities)

Activity	Time	Description
Staff Prayer	Pre-Start	Prayer team leads those who are available time of prayer.
Registration	Pre-Start	 Registration team registers arriving children. Expedition staff greet and welcome children and parents; direct childreninto the base camp (assembly room).
Setting Up Camp (opening assembly in Base Camp)	25 minutes	Trail Guide directs lively assembly that includes singing, offering, skits, <i>Crossover to Life</i> (daily portion of the Gospel presentation, beginning on Day 2), and <i>Trail Instructions</i> (daily announcements).
Trail Blazing (Trail Log work in Outpost classrooms)	30 minutes	Backpackers go to their <i>Outposts</i> (classrooms) and meet with their Guides and Assistant Guides, where they begin their day together, practice Scripture memory verses, review Bible Exploration (daily Bible reading in Training Log), discuss opportunities to serve others, and receive stickers.
Bible Lesson (Bible Lesson at Bible Lesson Site)	20 minutes	Backpackers head to the Bible Lesson Site where costumed Storytellers specifically chosen for that task alone present the Bible lesson. What the children hear during the Bible lesson is the central focus of Upward Bound and the foundation of all that happens during the week!
Trail Log Entry (Trail Log work in Outposts)	20 minutes	Backpackers return to their Outposts and meet with their Guides and Assistant Guides to discuss and complete Bible lesson application worksheets in their Trail Logs.
Trail Recreation	20 minutes	Backpackers go to Recreation Site for theme-related games.
Trail Treats	10 minutes	Children head to Snack Site for theme-related snacks.
Trail Crafts	20 minutes	Back packers go to craft site for theme related crafts.
Breaking Camp (closing assembly in Base Camp)	30 minutes	Breaking Camp closes out the Backpackers' day with all Expeditions gathering in Base Camp for singing, a brief reminder of the day's Bible lesson truths; and a closing prayer to end the day.
